A New Beginning in Joy and Creation

As we gather to celebrate our belated Anshe Emeth *Simchat Torah* and read *Parashat Beresheit*, we are reminded of the cyclical beauty of our Torah and our lives. Just as the seasons turn and the Jewish year renews, so too does our sacred text — with joy, with song, and with purpose.

On *Simchat Torah*, we complete the final verses of *Devarim* (Deuteronomy) and, without pause, begin again with *Beresheit* (Genesis). This seamless transition is more than a ritual; it's a profound symbol of our eternal relationship with the Torah. We dance with the scrolls not just because we finish reading them — but because we *never* finish. The Torah is our living document, always speaking, always renewing.

In Parashat Beresheit, we read the words:

"בָּרֵאשִׁית בַּרָא אֱלֹהִים אֶת הַשַּׁמַיִם וְאֵת הַארֵץ"

"In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." (Genesis 1:1)

These first words remind us of the sanctity of beginnings — that every moment is an opportunity to create, to renew, and to bring light into darkness. Just as God brings order to chaos in the days of creation, we are tasked with bringing kindness, justice, and peace into our world, every single day.

Both *Simchat Torah* and *Beresheit* highlight the value of *continuity* and *renewal*. They teach us that joy and purpose go hand in hand. We celebrate the past, but our eyes are always on the future — on what we can build, how we can grow, and how we can repair.

As some of you know, *Simchat Torah* is my favorite holy day. I am particularly moved by the music of these days — the songs of rejoicing as we circle the sanctuary with the Torah, and the melodies of the creation narrative that lift the soul. These sounds connect us not only to each other, but to generations before us who found meaning in the same sacred words.

May this season of new beginnings inspire us to create goodness in our homes, our synagogue, and our world. And may we never stop dancing with our Torah — in body, in heart, and in spirit.


